**EASTER MESSAGE:** Text from the Oration, which speaks of God, "who on this day through Thine only-begotten Son hast overcome death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life." From the Gradual: "This is the day which the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Truly, "this is the day which the Lord has made," and it behooves us to "rejoice and be glad in it." For though we ourselves were conquered by sin when our first parents succumbed to the devil's intrigue, yet now we have been liberated by our loving Saviour, who invincible and firm as a rock proved more than equal to all the plotting and planning of the demon. He has risen, and with Him we ourselves have risen; no longer need we fear the effects of sin - eternal damnation - but can hope with confidence and assurance for eternal salvation, according to the prayer in today's Mass, which reminds us that God has now "opened to us the gate of everlasting life." The past danger - original sin - is fled and gone. If only now we avoid the present and future danger - actual sin. And we can avoid it, for God has promised His grace, as the Oration of the Mass concludes, saying: "O God, . . . do Thou follow with Thine aid the desires that Thou hast put into our minds and by Thy continual help bring the same to good effect." The world, both of angels and of men, rejoices today. Finally, Holy Mother Church wants us to feel deep gratitude to God for thus "opening to us the gate of salvation." For in the Mass she prays and sings with fervor and joy: "Give praise unto the Lord, for He is good: for His mercy endures forever." Let us join with her in this fervor and joy!
